Sutter Roseville Medical Center delivers advanced and high-quality medical care in an environment that promotes healthier outcomes – a commitment that calls for modern facilities, advanced technology, dedication to patient- and family-centered care and highly trained physicians and care teams. We are committed to meeting the future needs of our community and region, and are proud to launch the first multi-disciplinary residency program in Placer County to train future physicians so that our patients can continue to have adequate access to quality care.

SRMC's graduate medical education (GME) physician training residency and fellowship programs will commence academic year 2022 (July 1, 2022), when we welcome our first cohort in the specialties of Internal Medicine and Surgery. We plan to add several more areas of focus over the coming five years. By 2027, SRMC's campus will have more than 100 learners training to provide excellent, compassionate care for decades to come.

Medical Office Building 10 on the Roseville campus will serve as the base of operations for the GME program, housing:

- Administrative offices
- Classrooms
- Conference space for didactics and lectures
- A simulation center
- Other shared space to support the development of these physician training programs

The majority of activity within this space will occur between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m., with occasional meetings, lectures and events held in the evening.

With challenges in recruiting physicians in many specialties and a high percentage of doctors nearing retirement age, this program will help establish a pipeline of highly qualified, "homegrown" physicians for the multi-county region served by Sutter Roseville. Moreover, the GME program will allow the next generation of hospitalists, surgeons, and other specialists to be immersed in the not-for-profit mission and vision of Sutter Health, providing care to more underserved people in Northern California than any other system.

The GME programs at Sutter Roseville are accredited by the Accreditation Council of Graduate Medical Education (<https://www.acgme.org>), are compliant with the Association of American Medical Colleges (<https://www.aamc.org>) and the individual specialties medical boards, and follow Centers for Medicare and Medicaid guidelines.
