January 1, 2026	<b>Election Cycle Begins-</b> 1 <sup>st</sup> day candidates can begin fundraising
July TBD	Roseville Candidate workshop Overview of the election process, city’s expectations, and resources.
<b>July 13, 2026</b>	<b>Nomination Period Opens:</b> First day to pick up nomination papers. Candidate filing period starts at <b>8 a.m.</b> <b>Schedule an appointment</b> with City Clerk Office.
July 31, 2026	Last day to file semi-annual campaign statements. Period covered: committee initial date to 6/30/2026
August 5, 2026	First day campaign signs can be displayed. Per the Municipal Code Title 17 Chapter 17.10
<b>August 7, 2026</b>	<b>Nomination Period Closes:</b> Last day to file nomination papers. Candidate filing deadline at <b>5 p.m.</b> <b>Schedule an appointment</b> for filing with City Clerk’s Office. * Last day for a Candidate to withdraw
August 8, 2026	<u>Candidate Statement</u> of Qualification (CSQ) may be withdrawn by 5 pm.
August 8-17, 2026	Public Examination Period-Candidate statements, Names, and Ballot designations are open for public examination.
August 13, 2026	SOS: Random alphabet draw to be held at 11:00 a.m. to determine the ballot order of candidates’ names.
September 7,2026 – October 20, 2026	Write-in candidate filing period. -Candidates who want to have their name appear on the ballot and did not meet the nomination period deadlines.
September 24, 2026	<b>1<sup>st</sup> pre-election</b> campaign statements (Form 460) due. Period covered: 7/1/26 – 9/19/26
<b>October 5, 2026</b>	- <b>Ballots mailed</b> to all active registered voters. - Voter Information Guides (VIG) mailed to voters by this date.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- First day for conditional voter registration for this election.</li> <li>- First day County may begin processing VBM ballots. (begins 29<sup>th</sup> day before the election EC 15101 B)</li> </ul>
October 20, 2026	<p>First day for conditional voter registration for this election.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-new voters can register to vote beginning 14 days before an election.</li> </ul>
October 22, 2026	<p><b>2<sup>nd</sup> pre-election</b> campaign statements (Form 460) due Period covered: 9/20/26 – 10/17/26</p>
October 27, 2026	Last day voters can request a vote-by-mail (VBM) ballot.
Oct. 24- November 3 <sup>rd</sup>	<b>Vote Centers Open</b>
<b>November 3, 2026</b>	<b>ELECTION DAY!!!</b>
November 10, 2026	Last day Vote-by-Mail ballots can be received by the County to be counted. (VBM up to 7 days after election. (E.C. 3020(b) Section1,2)
November 13, 2026	Last day to take down all campaign signs.
December 3, 2026	Placer County completes Official Canvass Canvass must be completed within 30 days of the election. (E.C. 15301,15400,15401,15372)
December 9 - 16, 2026 TBD	Oath of Office administered to newly elected Councilmembers.
December 31, 2026	Election Cycle Ends.
February 1, 2027	Semi-Annual Campaign Statements (Form 460) due. Period: 10/18/26 -12/31/2026

- Last Day to register to vote 10/19/26
- New Citizen registers to vote 10/20/26 - 11/3/26
