

Fire Department Fast Facts

- The Roseville Fire Department currently operates nine engines and two ladder trucks out of eight fire stations strategically located throughout the City. The City's ninth fire station is currently under construction at Woodcreek Oaks and Painted Desert Dr with an anticipated opening this fall. The Fire Department has an FTE staff of 131 which includes civilian administrative employees. Thirty-seven firefighters are on-duty every day to provide fire suppression, emergency medical services, technical rescue, hazardous materials response, and general assistance to the businesses, residents, and visitors of Roseville.
- The Roseville Fire Department Fire and Life Safety Division aims to improve the quality of life for the citizens of Roseville through the development and application of fire prevention education, engineering, and enforcement practices for Fire Systems and the inspection and enforcement of hazardous materials used by businesses throughout the City. The division is comprised of highly trained and certified professionals who work towards improving the level of safety within our community. Additionally, the Fire & Life Safety Division is the focal point of the department's efforts to educate the public in a variety of ways to improve their level of safety at home and at work.
- Development in the West Roseville, Creekview, Sierra Vista, and Amoruso Ranch specific plan areas along with any annexations west of Roseville that may occur have already added an increase in demand for fire and emergency services. The Fire Department monitors call volume and response times in these areas on a quarterly basis to help inform decisions on resource deployment and the need for additional fire stations. The Fire Department anticipates that Fire Station 10 will be the next station built in Roseville. Fire station 10 will serve neighborhoods in the Sierra Vista and West Roseville specific plan areas.

Not all cities have firefighters/first responders who are also paramedics, as we do in Roseville. This enhanced level of service protects our community to a greater degree by being able to provide Advance Life Support (ALS) measures when needed, prior to the arrival of an private ambulance that transports the patient to the hospital. The Roseville Fire Department Emergency Medical Services First Responder Fee, permitted under Roseville Municipal Code chapter 9.27 and State law, is a cost recovery mechanism for first responder paramedic services. Emergency Medical Services First responder fees have become an industry standard among cities with this response capability to help offset the cost of the enhanced paramedic level of service provided by all of our engine and truck companies.
