

Guide to Setting Orbit timers for Drought Restrictions

- Your Orbit timer should look something like this. It may vary a little, but the same basic functions should apply. If you're having issues with it, feel free to give us a call!



- Turn the dial so that "How Often" is at the 9 O'Clock spot. "How Often" is the setting for watering days.



- Use the left and right arrows to navigate to a certain day. The day currently selected will flash.



- Use the “+” and “-” buttons to turn days off and on to match the watering restriction days. Days that are on should have a box around them while days that are off will not.



- While we're at this, let's make sure we're watering out lawns properly. First turn your dial to Run Time. And select the station numbers that correspond with your sod with the left and right arrows. Then adjust the runtimes of that station with the “+” and “-” buttons and input between 3-5 minutes. Some Orbit timers need you to click the center “Enter” button after each adjustment, so do this after adjusting each station.
