# Calling the police

### Always call 9-1-1 for any crime in progress

Call 9-1-1 immediately if your personal safety is threatened, any time you see or hear somebody yelling for help, see someone being physically attacked, or anyone being forced into a vehicle against their will.

#### Suspicious behavior that could be a crime in progress:

- Someone yelling or screaming
- Someone running from a car or house
- Someone looking into house or car windows/trying doors
- A stranger entering a neighbor's unoccupied home or yard
- Someone going door to door asking unusual questions
- A stranger removing property from unoccupied homes or closed businesses
- Business transactions conducted from a vehicle
- A stranger following or bothering children
- Strangers loitering in the neighborhood

#### What information will the police ask for?

##### Location of the crime

*Street name, house number, closest intersection*

##### Caller or contact name

*First and last*

##### Callback phone number with Area Code

##### Is the crime in progress?

*Did it just happen?*

*How long ago?*

##### Did you see **weapons**?

*What kind of weapons?*

##### Are there **injuries**?

##### Suspect information

*How many, Do you know them?*

##### Physical Description(s)

*Race, gender, age, hair color/style, build, facial hair, tattoos*

##### Clothing Description

*Top to bottom (i.e. hat, shirt, pants, shoes)*

*Inside out (i.e. t-shirt, jacket)*
